## OWHA URGENT ACTION ITEM - January 28, 2022

RE: OWHA PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 2022

ACTION: DEADLINE FOR RESPONSE: Monday, January 31, 2022, 11:00 p.m.

### **OVERVIEW**

- 1) On January 31, 2022, hockey practices and games are permitted to resume in the Province of Ontario
- 2) The 2022 OWHA Provincial Championships are currently scheduled for April 7<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup>
- 3) Ice is currently blocked at multiple facilities
- 4) The event was cancelled for the last 2 years due to the pandemic
- 5) The pandemic is still active and, if we move forward, the event could be cancelled at any time before or during the event
- 6) We are committed to facing the risks and challenges and move forward with plans to hold a provincial championship that is adapted to health and safety requirements
- 7) The physical and mental health of participants is of primary importance.

### **ACTION ITEMS**

- 1) Teams commit, in writing, to participation in playdowns and provincials by Monday, January 31, 2022 DEADLINE FOR RESPONSE: Monday, January 31, 2022, 11:00 p.m.
- 2) Playdowns commence as soon as possible AFTER Thursday, February 3, 2022

### OWHA PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

# **COMMITMENT**

Send email to all OWHA registered competitive teams ASAP advising:

- Provincial Championships are currently scheduled for OWHA U9, U11, U13, U15, U18, U22 and Senior Divisions
- We require a commitment to the event and playdowns
- The entry fee for U22 Elite and U18 AA teams is \$1,200.00 per team. The entry fee for other teams is \$1,000.00 and is payable no later than <u>Tuesday</u>. February 15, 2022. The fee is refundable ONLY if the team does not qualify through playdowns or is required to withdraw due to <u>COVID</u>-19.
- We urge associations/teams to ensure players and parents are in agreement and make a full commitment to attending playdowns and provincials before making the commitment
- If the team withdraws after its January 31<sup>st</sup> commitment, the provincial fee will still be due and will <u>NOT</u> be refunded
- It is understood that teams and players may be required to drop out due to <u>COVID</u>-19. These teams may receive a partial or full refund, at the sole discretion of the OWHA
- These actions are being taking to ensure accountability of each team for the benefit of all teams

### **ROSTER**

- Player rosters are "frozen" as of December 31, 2021
- Staff may be added
- Rosters will be pulled from RAMP
- No players may be added and no pick-up players permitted for playdowns or <u>Provincials</u> for any reason, including <u>COVID</u>-19
- All teams must have at least one (1) registered and playing goaltender
- In extenuating circumstances only, OWHA will address a request for the use of an emergency goaltender

#### **NUMBER OF TEAMS**

- Based on health and safety, divisions/categories will be kept to a minimum
- The absolute maximum number of teams in any division/category will be 20
- Preferred division/categories are 8 or 16 teams.

### **PLAYDOWNS**

- Playdowns are to commence <u>AFTER Thursday</u>, February <u>3</u>, <u>2022</u> and are to be completed no later than <u>Sunday</u>, March <u>13</u>, <u>2022</u>
- Teams may use <u>one (1)</u> game to count in both league and playdown statistics with approval of both OWHA and the person responsible for the league
- Each group MUST designate a person responsible for ensuring the playdown operates efficiently, keep records and report the outcome to the OWHA office.
- Due to a critical shortage of officials in many areas, playdown games in all divisions and categories will be scheduled with two (2) qualified on-ice officials.
- Playdowns will be limited to as few games as possible and will be as follows:
  - 2 teams 2 games with a tie breaker. There will be no third game
  - o 3 teams a single round robin with a tie breaker
  - o 4 teams a single round robin with a tie breaker
  - 5 teams a single round robin with a tie breaker
  - 6 teams divide teams geographically and have a 2 x 3 team single round robin.
    If only 1 of 6 teams move on, the 2 winners play a single game to determine a winner.
    If 2 teams move on, the two winners advance
  - 7 teams divide teams geographically into a 3 and a 4-team grouping and play as per the 6-team formula
  - 8 teams divide teams geographically into 2 x 4 teams and play as per the 6 and
    7 team formula
  - 9 teams divide teams geographically into 3 groups of 3 and play a single round robin. The 3 winners would play a single round robin
  - 10 teams divide teams geographically into 2 groups of 3 and 1 group of 4. There will be a single round robin of the winners to determine who advances
  - 11 teams divide teams geographically into 1 group of 3 and 2 groups of 4 and play as in the 10-team formula
  - 12 teams divide teams geographically into 4 groups of 3 and play a single round robin. The top 4 teams play a single round robin

### **ON-ICE OFFICIALS**

- Games may be officiated with a 2-official system in both OWHA Playdowns and Provincials.
- Some games may have 3 officials

### **GAME SHEETS**

• If hard copy game sheets are used, labels from RAMP will be used and no signatures are required.

### **REGISTRATION DESK**

1 person per team is required to check in prior to the team's 1<sup>st</sup> game

## **SOUVENIRS**

• There will be on-line souvenirs only

#### **PROGRAM**

- There will no program or hand-outs.
- All materials will be transmitted electronically

#### **MEDALS**

• Gold, <u>Silver</u> and <u>Bronze</u> medals will be handed to the team staff for presentation to their team

## **DISCIPLINE**

- OWHA discipline is in place
- Any participant under suspension is not permitted in the facility
- OWHA will suspend and/or remove a participant and/or team for violation of <u>COVID</u>-19 protocols at any time including, but not limited to playdowns and provincials.

# **COVID-19 PROTOCOLS**

- All <u>COVID-19</u> protocols are in place including but not limited to:
  - Active Screening
  - Masks
  - QR codes for vaccinations
  - Capacity limits
  - o Entry and exit times of facilities
  - Physical Distancing

## **VOLUNTEERS**

- Volunteers for Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday are required at all facilities.
- Each association, especially in the geographic area of the provincials, is urged to provide a minimum of one (1) volunteer so the event can take place.
- OWHA requires a minimum of <a href="three">three</a> (3) volunteers in every facility at all times, commencing <a href="one-(1)">one</a> (1) hour before the start of the first game until ½ hour after the completion of the last game.

• An experienced, screened volunteer who makes a commitment to a 10 hour shift on Friday, Saturday and Sunday will have costs covered for travel and accommodation (based on double occupancy) and receive a per diem for meals.

# **COMMUNICATION**

- All communication is to be done via phone or electronically where possible
- In-person communication must be down with physical distancing and masking protocols in place

## **CANCELLATION**

- Teams are committing with the understanding that the event may, in whole or in part, be cancelled at any time.
- <u>NO team</u> will be re-imbursed for any costs it incurs for travel, accommodation or for any other costs if the event is cancelled at any time.
